

Things are really moving at pace. Arbour Court is nearly finished and it will deliver the first 52 homes we are working on. Painting and landscaping are progressing well and we look forward to completing them next month. Work is progressing well on 159 homes on Fleming Court, Shuckford Court, Leleu Court and Mather Court and we expect to start the internal finishes in early March. The structural frame of Nonsuch Court, Fifeshire Court, Forge Court and Whennel Court which will feature 215 homes also continues to progress well.

Finally, building work of 124 new homes at Wheelers Cross is well underway with the structural frame soon starting to appear above the hoarding in the next couple of months.


My Place is the council's housing management service. They are your go-to team for all your needs as a resident.

A leafy lane for Barking



New plans to transform a stretch of Gascoigne Road into a tree-lined walk way safe for pedestrians and cyclists have been unveiled.

The proposals aim to create better links between the east and western halves of Gascoigne.

Archie Bashford, Senior Landscape Architect at Be First, said: "We want to create a more harmonious use of a stretch of the road transforming it into a safer and more attractive environment for pedestrians and cyclists and especially children walking to school."

"We will listen to residents, schools, community facilities, businesses and people who use the road, identifying key concerns and work with local people to understand how we might make it a happier, healthier and safer place to be for all."

Baz meets Daz

Councillor Darren Rodwell, Leader of Barking and Dagenham Council, met staff working on the latest redevelopment phase of the neighbourhood.

Muhammed 'Baz' Irbaz Ali, who is from Dagenham and is an Apprentice Document Controller at Willmott Dixon, said: "To be able to be directly involved in the regeneration of my local area, knowing that it will positively impact current and future generations, is something I'm incredibly proud to be a part of."

The latest phase of building work includes 124 homes which are set to be finished in the Autumn of 2023.

Gascoigne Residents' Forum

For our latest interview with members of the Gascoigne Residents' Forum (GRF), we spoke to Matthias Beirens.





Q. Why did you join the Gascoigne Residents' Forum?

A. The main reason is that Barking is being transformed dramatically. I feel it empowering to be part of the discussion. I also find it impossible to say no to such an opportunity as you can't complain in five years that you don't like the result if you didn't even go and sit at the table to discuss what is important. Secondly, I do actually like architecture, urban planning and design, so I do find it fun to look at the presentations with a glass of wine on a Thursday!

Q. What is it like being part of the GRF?

A. It's informative, educational, and empowering. Being part of a very multicultural group in every aspect. It broadens your mind in general on how a 30-year-old financial worker, 40-year-old single mum and a 25-year-old from a minority background look at things with different priorities. It's very interesting seeing things from different perspectives. It is educational to see how these things work in urban planning and architecture and how these plans all come together. But finally, it is empowering because we are listened to. Yes, we don't get everything we want as with everything in life, but our voice does make a difference. It's not just a political PR show.

Q. What impact has the GRF made to the local Gascoigne community?

A. We have had direct impact in Phoenix Park and community centre. But also, I have got to know at least 10 neighbours better which also strengthens our local community.

Q. What impact has the GRF made to you?

A. Learning about the different points of view. My main lesson is the understanding 'others' part of it.

What's happening in your area?

What's happening in Gascoigne West?

All three phases of development on this side of the area are now ready for development or have construction underway.

Building work on Phase 1 is due to be finished in April – 201 new homes with rents from £137 per week. We'll be planting more trees and improving the public spaces. Phoenix Park the community co-designed pop up park is open and being enjoyed by local residents.

And building work on phase 2 has also started which will deliver 386 new homes for local people. Work is due to be completed in March 2024.

This phase of redevelopment was completed in March 2019 and all the homes are now occupied. The Gascoigne Community Centre has now moved to its temporary home in the unit under Lariat Court until its permanent home in Phase 2 is completed.



Demolition has been completed. Construction is underway on the first homes and will be completed in April. Further phases will start over the next year.

RIPPLE ROAD

Greatfields School

Once the school is complete, it will be an all-through education campus for a total of 2,400 primary, secondary and sixth form students.

PHASE 3A & 3B

Phase 3A and 3B East

Phase 3A has demolition underway and the construction of 200 new homes will commence in early 2022. Phase 3B has rehousing still ongoing.

ROOKWOOD HOUSE

Moving home

Residents are still moving from Phase 3B and this will continue till mid 2022. If you live in this phase you should have been contacted by a Be First Rehousing Co-ordinator to assist with your move.

Phase 4 is a large phase that will be handled block by block. The visits to the first blocks in phase 4 have started and will continue throughout this year.
