New boxing club is a total knock-out!

In the first of a regular feature on local residents, we talk to Tony Hurrell, founder and coach of Marks Gate Boxing Club.

Tony saw the demand for organised children's sport in Marks Gate and used his passion to create a boxing club for local youngsters. He runs two learn to box sessions every Friday, one for 8 - 10 year olds and another for 11 -15 year olds. This club has proven to be a hit already, as it is already at capacity.

Tony has been boxing for twelve years and was inspired by his younger brother, who found boxing just as he was heading down the wrong path, and it helped him turn his life around.

But, it was his daughter who motivated him to get the ball rolling and create the club after she shared her aspiration of opening a gym in the area.

Tony hopes that the boxing club will offer the kids and teens in the community a potential lifelong passion

and teach them the importance of fitness from a young age. It is also a part of his long-term vision, with the end goal

being a purpose-built boxing gym in Marks Gate for an amateur boxing club,

which will give children the facilities to excel in boxing and achieve their potential.

In Tony's words:
"Sport can help you
realise your potential,
and the sooner you realise
this, the more life changing it is.

That's why I wanted to offer this service to the children in Marks Gate, to teach them, to guide them to reach their goals.

Boxing is about motivation just as much as it's about skill, which is why a club is useful when you are first starting out, as seeing other people's success can activate motivation in you."

Report



e are proud to have sponsored the "Countdown to Christmas" this month, which was a fantastic event to kick-off the festive season.

Come see us and HTA Design Landscape Architects on Thursday 20 January at "Meet the Contractors" to talk about progress and see the exciting plans for improvements to Padnall Lake. There will be two sessions, one in the afternoon and one in the evening. Further details about times and location will follow soon via a dedicated flyer through your door.

Looking ahead to 2022, our teams will be visiting Rose Lane Primary School and The Warren School to provide site safety talks and support careers days to inspire pupils interested in learning more about what it's like to work in construction.

Improving Padnall Lake

We have started work to improve the lake by removing all the rubbish and cleaning the water. Moving across the lake in stages from West to East, we will be pumping out water, cleaning and desilting. Specialist experts are working alongside us to relocate the fish within the lake, away from where we are working.

Our approach for each section of the lake is:

- Install a dam to isolate the working section of the lake;
- Employ a specialist team to relocate the fish from the working section to the remaining part of the lake. A special permit for this activity has been obtained by the Environmental Agency;
- Pump the water from the working section to the remaining part of the lake;
- De-silt and clean this section of the lake:
- Install Gabion Baskets in the perimeter of the lake with a fixed wildfowl fencing;
- Remove the dam and raise the water to previous

As well as improving the lake, we will be planting new trees and a variety of plant life. As part of this landscape design, some existing trees will need to be removed under the guidance of an ecologist.

These works are due for completion by the end of January, after which there will be opportunities

for volunteers to get involved with the next stages of landscaping.
